The focus this month will be fly fishing in Montana, particularly the western part of the state. Our guest speaker will be outfitter and guide Joe Cummings. He comes to us with high praise from several members of our club who make annual pilgrimages each September to fish with Joe.

Joe is owner of A Classic Journey Outfitters and is a 4th generation Montana native who has spent his life either working on the Stevensville family ranch or with his feet wet in Western Montana waters. After Joe spent 5

Back to School !

As winter takes hold and the icy winds blow, all but the hardest and perhaps most insane of us put away our gear and settle in to wait out the chill. It's not long before cabin fever sets in and we grow restless and weary of the confines of our homes and work places. Luckily for the fly fisher there is work that can be done to prepare ourselves for the upcoming season. The only thing that compares with hooking a trout on a fly is hooking one on a fly which you yourself crafted.

Perhaps you've never tied a fly in your life. Or, you've tried before but couldn't quite "get it". Maybe you have taken up the craft and are ready to take it to the next level. Well there are classes coming up at several locations which are being taught by long standing members of the Main Line Fly Tyers that might be of interest to you

Sam Vigorita and Dave Shillington will be teaching fly tying at the Upper Moreland High School. The classes are on Thursday night beginning on January 27th and run for 6 weeks (7pm-9pm). Dave will be teaching the beginners class. This course goes over the basic tools and materials required for this hobby. Students will begin tying basic flies by the second class. Everything including nymphs, wets, dries, and streamers will be covered.

An advance class will also be offered and is going to be taught by Sam. For this class Sam has promised that he intends to "give up some secret flies for a couple of very misunderstood hatches that most people are never prepared for". Sam will also focus on the techniques required to tie the classic married wing wet fly.



He also promises to teach another secret of what gives his nymphs the edge over the original classic patterns.

A Fly Fishing Tactics and Strategies class will also be offered at the Upper Moreland High School and is taught by Sam Vigorita. This class meets beginning February 1st and runs for 5 Tuesday nights from 7 to 9 pm. Sam has been teaching this course for quite a while and it has been very well received. Sam is also going to be teaching this course on Wednesday nights starting February 2nd at the Sporting Gentleman Fly Shop in Media. It will be a two hour class that begins at 7pm and runs for 5 weeks. Those interested should contact the fly shop at (610) 565-6140 as soon as possible to register as space is limited.



Mike Ebner and Ed Emery will also be teaching fly tying in Lower Providence. This course is through the Lower Providence

Parks and Recreation Department and is held at the Shoemaker House which is next to the Lower Providence Library. The class will be on Tuesday nights from 7pm to 9 pm beginning February 22nd and will run for 6 weeks. Ed will be directing the beginner class which is pretty similar to the course mentioned above being taught by Dave Shillington. In it he will be providing the beginner with the basics needed to get them started tying their own flies. By the end of the class the student will have learned to tie the basic flymph series used by club members and have all the flies necessary to start off the spring trout season. At the same time, Mike Ebner will be teaching an intermediate level course that is designed to take those completing the beginner course to the next level. Mike will poll the class on the first night to see which flies the group would like to learn to tie based on their fishing preferences.

From Pennsylvania Turnpike (I-276)

Take Exit 333 (Norristown - old exit 25). At the end of the ramp, turn left onto Plymouth Road. At the light, turn right onto Germantown Pike West. Continue approximately one (1) mile, through four (4) traffic lights (not counting the left hand turn light at Sandy Hill Road). At the fifth light, turn right onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.

From Blue Route (I-476)

Take exit for Germantown Pike West (Exit 20). Continue on Germantown Pike west for approximately one (1) mile, through five (5) traffic lights (not counting the left hand turn light at Sandy Hill Road). At the fifth light, turn right onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.

From Route 202

Follow Route 202 to Germantown Pike. Travel EAST on Germantown Pike, through five (5) traffic lights. At the next traffic light, approximately half a mile, turn left onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.
