Rick Nyles:

Penns Creek “The Hatch Factory”



Rick Nyles has been fly fishing for over forty years, guiding since 1999, and as business grew he started Sky Blue Outfitters. One of the best dry fly fishing guides you will find in Pennsylvania, Rick offers guided trips that will increase understanding and skill level when fishing for rising trout. Rick also teaches nymphing and streamer techniques, and has a

simple "back to basic" approach for fishermen who have forgotten what got them where they are today. Sky Blue Outfitter's Orvis and Trout Unlimited endorsed guide service offers walk and wade, drift boat trip and overnight packages on the best streams in PA, including Penns Creek, Lehigh River, Big Fishing Creek, Spring Creek, Bald Eagle Creek, Pine Creek, Slate Run, Elk Creek, Kettle Creek, Brodhead Creek, Tulpehocken Creek, Manatawny Creek, Pohopoco, Mud Run, Lackawana River, Class A Wild Trout Streams, Little Juniata River, Susquehanna River as well as destination trips to Montana and the Outer Banks.

Rick is a celebrity fly tier and presenter at The Fly Fishing Shows and placed 3rd in the Orvis Fly Tying Contest with his Green Drake pattern. His authoring includes contributions to Bob Mallard's "50 Best Places Fly Fishing in the Northeast" and Tom Gilmore's "Flyfisher's Guide to Pennsylvania" and contributions to numerous articles in newspapers and magazines.

The title of Rick's presentation is "Penns Creek-The Hatch Factory." Rick will discuss the creek, hatches and techniques on being a better dry fly angler. He will also show off his productive flies for the spring hatch, Little Black Stonefly to the Green Drake.

Last month

Jason Randall: Advanced Nymph Fishing Tactics.

Last month Jason Randall gave an extremely entertaining and informative presentation on the topic of nymph fishing tactics. He also discussed some of the new Czech/polish techniques of nymphing.


I found his discussion of how water at different depths in the water column flows at different speeds very informative and had a lot of fishing implications. Water movement in a stream is not the simple, smooth that it appears to be. The sides move more slowly than the center and the middle of the water column is moving faster than the top or bottom. This creates real problems, such as drag on the nymph and the inability to detect strikes, when deep water nymphing. It is also why strike indicators are often not very effective.

Czech nymphing was interesting and clearly very effective in certain water. I am not sure it what most us consider fly fishing since there really isn't any casting. It reminded me of when I was kid fishing with those old 12-foot bamboo sticks. You would tie a string to the top and at the other end of the string tie a bobber and worm/grasshopper/dry fly. That was great fun and very effective against bluegills. You couldn't call it fly fishing because the rod only cost a dollar. (Anyone know where you can get some of those bamboo poles today?)

From Pennsylvania Turnpike (I-276)

Take Exit 333 (Norristown - old exit 25). At the end of the ramp, turn left onto Plymouth Road. At the light, turn right onto Germantown Pike West. Continue approximately one (1) mile, through four (4) traffic lights (not counting the left hand turn light at Sandy Hill Road). At the fifth light, turn right onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.

From Blue Route (I-476)

Take exit for Germantown Pike West (Exit 20). Continue on Germantown Pike west for approximately one (1) mile, through five (5) traffic lights (not counting the left hand turn light at Sandy Hill Road). At the fifth light, turn right onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.

From Route 202

Follow Route 202 to Germantown Pike. Travel EAST on Germantown Pike, through five (5) traffic lights. At the next traffic light, approximately half a mile, turn left onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.
